### National Leadership Seminar

*Scouts from Totanhan Nakaha Lodge along with section Chief Dan Kobler at the National Leadership Seminar.*

On April 19, 2013 - April 21, 2013, several arrow men from Totanhan Nakaha lodge attended the National Leadership seminar or NLS for short, at Camp Wilderness near Park Rapids, Minnesota. These Arrowmen learned skills that they will be able to use to benefit their lodge, chapter, troop, and other areas of their lives. NLS is put on by the central region, so it is rare for an NLS to be so close to home for our lodge.

The national site states that the National Leadership Seminar is a weekend conference on the skills and

attributes of leadership. It is intended primarily to enhance the leadership skills of the Order of the Arrow's key youth and adult members as they seek to improve their services to the Boy Scouts of America and the greater community. The weekend format is designed to complement the longer, more detailed Wood Badge and Junior Leadership Training Programs. Near the end of the seminar, participants make a contract with themselves to apply the skills studied in the seminar on projects in their lodge, council, and community.

In completing this contract, the participants display what they have learned at the conference as well as explore new ways of cheerful service. If an opportunity to attend NLS comes up in the near future, the lodge covers the cost of attendance, so if you have the

desire to learn more about how to be an effective leader, do not hesitate to attend NLS.



### Section Conclave

This year's section conclave theme is "The Journey to Find the Arrow". The conclave will be held at Northern Tier High Adventure Base in Ely, Minnesota and hosted by Ka'Niss Ma'Ingan Lodge. The cost is \$35 before August 23<sup>rd</sup>. Program will include training sessions in the morning that will enable youth and adults to bring a better program back to their home unit. Saturday afternoon activities will include a Native American Pow-Wow, Ceremony Team Evaluations, and many other activities that are still in the planning stages. The new brotherhood ceremony approved by National at this year's national planning meeting will also be shown to members for the first time. \$35 to attend northern Tier is a great value and section conclave is ramping up to be tons of fun. 
### Tenure Pins

Our modern Order is a bit more complex than its humble beginnings; however this upcoming national conference marks the 100<sup>th</sup> year of the OA. This NOAC will be the biggest and best NOAC in the OA's 100 year history, drawing 10,000 arrow men to Michigan State University. There will be a special sash for all attendees, being red with a white arrow. Signups will begin in the fall of 2014, but plan soon as this will be a very popular event.

Alertness to the needs of others is the mark of the Vigil Honor. It calls for an individual with an unusual awareness of the possibilities within each situation.

The Vigil Honor is the highest honor that the Order of the Arrow can bestow upon its members for service to lodge, council, and Scouting. Membership cannot be won by a person's conscious endeavors.

The Vigil Honor is a high mark of distinction and recognition reserved for those Arrowmen who, by reason of exceptional service, personal effort, and unselfish interest, have made distinguished contributions beyond the immediate responsibilities of their position of office to one or more of the following:

- Lodge
- Order of the Arrow
- Scouting community
- Scout Camp

### Minimize the Sash and Dash

Experienced Arrow men sometimes forget what it's like to be a brand-new Ordeal member. The principles taught during the Ordeal, and the information presented at a new member orientation, can be overwhelming.

When does a new Ordeal member get to digest this information and, at the same time, introduce his family to the OA?

How about your chapter hosting a new member dinner each year after the induction weekend? Invite the new Ordeal Members and their parents. At the dinner, re-introduce the OA to your newest members, explain the chapter's various committees and invite participation, offer insight into how the OA is structured, and encourage attendance at upcoming events. The dinner can include a "Question & Answer" session.

The chapter adviser can also have a separate meeting with the parents in attendance. The adviser can introduce adult advisers, encourage youth participation, and provide parents with confidence in the youth leadership of the chapter.
