

#### **NOAC 2018**

Sign up now for the 2018 National Order of the Arrow Conference (NOAC). The 2018 conference is July 30th to Aug 8th, 2018 at Indiana University in Bloomington Indiana. NOAC is the largest gathering of Arrowmen. During your time at NOAC you have the chance to meet over 8,000 other Arrowmen from across the Nation.

You will be able to play dodge ball, capture the flag and numerous other games. PLUS - if you don't like to cook, this is the trip for you! All the meals are prepared for you in the college cafeteria. You will be staying in the dorm rooms on campus.

There are ceremony and dance team competition, an awesome OA Trading Post and the second patch trading event after the National Jamboree. There are exhibitors with the latest in camping and outdoor equipment and High Adventure trip planning. Interested in the history of OA? See it in the Museum of OA and Scouting History.

NOAC not only has lots of fun opportunities but it's educational too! You attend classes to improve your leadership skills that you can bring back to your unit and Lodge or learn what it's like to be a Lodge Chief.

Other classes include OATR training, helping the Boys in Blue, Webelos to Boy Scout crossover, conducting a Vigil Callout ceremony and many more.

The national NOAC committee has instituted a quota for the 2018 conference and is enforcing a 3:1 youth to adult ratio; our current quota is **65 youth and 21 adults.** 

We are registering youth on a first come, first accepted basis. Each youth expressing interest in attending NOAC must make a \$100 deposit at time of registration. For adults, we are collecting names of interested OA members. In January, the youth NOAC committee will execute a selection process.

The cost to attend NOAC is approximately \$750. Final costs will be announced February 1st 2018. The cost to attend NOAC includes registration fees, transportation to and from Indiana University, room, meals, swag (tee shirts, patches etc.) Sign up now to get your youth spot reserved!

## The Order of the Arrow Obligation

I, (your name), do hereby promise on my honor as a Scout, that I will always and faithfully observe and preserve the traditions of the Order of the Arrow, Wimachtendienk, Wingolauchsik, Witahemui. I will always regard the ties of Brotherhood in the Order of the Arrow as lasting, and will seek to preserve a cheerful spirit even in the midst of irksome tasks and weighty responsibilities, and will endeavor, so far as in my power lies, to be unselfish in service and devotion to the welfare of others.

What does "Wimachtendienk Wingolauchsik Witahemui" mean?

It stands for Wimachtendienk, Wingolauchsik, Witahemui. Which in the Lenni Lenape language means "Brotherhood of Cheerful Service."

When in scouting or in your daily lives, remember to cheerfully help others. It is why you were asked to be a member of the Order of the Arrow.
